The President's Message



Several years ago at a chapter meeting, the guest speakers were from the FBI. Not only was the presentation very interesting, but the agents brought along some of the equipment they used. It was very well received by the chapter members. However that display paled in comparison to the "display" we had on Sunday. Our guest speakers, Trooper/Paramedics Neil Williamson and Chris Hecht came with one of the tools of their trade; a Bell Helicopter, 407 masterfully piloted by retired CWO4 Jon Jonas. Arranged for by Rev. Vernon Harms and

Ron Darrah of the Robson Organization, the aircraft landed right behind the Madera Clubhouse. It was truly a sight to see. The static display was the culmination of one of the most interesting presentation of the year.



Trooper/Paramedic Armstrong presented a through overview of the "air arm" or aviation unit of DPS. One may think that the primary mission of the aviation unit is rescuing wayward hikers. Neil told us that was just a segment of the mission. The aviation unit is the state's airline; it is a cargo carrying unit utilizing two helicopters provided by the US Government. These "flying" boxcars were originally purchased by the CIA for \$14,000,000 each. When the CIA determined they were no longer needed, the State of Arizona was able to get them for a bargain price! Free less some relatively minor costs and the promise to keep them in shape.

The unit is equipped with a wide variety of aircraft. The most "visible" is the 2nd Generation, Jet Ranger 407. Those familiar with Army Aviation remember it predecessor, the 206 Jet Ranger or the OH 58. The widely used helicopters, which can carry a crew of 10, will rescue from land or water: will land near you or above you and bring you up during the daylight or at night. They will transport you to a medical facility or go get the medicine you need when it is not locally available.

Add to those duties assisting the Highway Patrol and being strategically located from Kingman to Tucson, this unit is a real asset to our citizens, especially in the life saving roll.

In process now is the consolidation of four segments of state government that possess aircraft. They are the DPS Aviation unit, ADOT, Department of Agriculture and Fish & Game. Costs have been reduced by consolidation and better use of existing assets.

The presentation was very well done and our members asked some thoughtful questions. The only limitation was the rather tight schedule with the 407 having to depart by 1430, lest there be a revolt by local golfers. Thank you: Neil, Chris and Jon for a very interesting program.

Get To Know Your Members

Lt Col Richard Johnston USAF (ret)



Lt Col Dick Johnston began his career with the US Army in 1954. Commissioned through ROTC at the University of Missouri, Columbia where he also received a BS degree in Theater/Radio/TV production. Subsequent to Commissioning Col Johnston attended Officers Basic in Field Artillery at Fort Sill, OK. It was there in the Old Post Chapel that he and his wife Pat were married. Shipped Germany, Lt Col Johnston joined an 8" Howitzer Battalion. This unit had an atomic capability and it was Lt Col Johnston's misfortune to have been in the field along the East-West German border most of the time for three and a half year's. Learning from this Lt Col Johnston transferred to Military Intelligence Branch. This garnered him two years in Viet Nam, three more tours to

Europe in The Netherlands, Belgium, and another tour to Germany. Three tours to Fort Hood, TX for a total of nine years finished off the active career.

Upon retirement in 1984, Lt Col Johnston joined Martin Marietta Astronautics in Denver, CO where he worked as a Manager for Program Security. After 15 years he retired from what had become Lockheed Martin Astronautics and he and Pat moved to The Colony, TX. He signed on with the Federal Disaster Management Agency (FEMA) where he served as a Disaster Assistance employee. His final retirement was in 2005 but he was immediately swept up with MOAA. He served as the 1st VP for the North Dallas Chapter followed by three years as the Chapter President. The By-Laws prevented tours of more than three years in the job and he thankfully passed the baton to another "volunteer".

Pat and Dick split their time between their homes in Esparanza Estates here in Green Valley and a home in Gleneagle across from the AF Academy in Colorado Springs. Surprisingly the Johnstons have survived living in such close proximity to an Air Force facility!
