
GET TO KNOW YOUR MEMBERS

At Brown one of our Navy instructors started a program to provide private licenses at Navy expense. The idea was to reduce washout rate in flight training. I started that program in September and had my license in November.

A week after graduation, Jackie Holst and I were married. The first of our 11 Navy moves was to Little Creek, VA awaiting my Pensacola, FL class to start. Luckily for us the ship was in overhaul and I didn't have to go to sea. Then off to Pensacola, Meridian, MS, and back to Pensacola for first carrier qualifications. Marlon Ruiz, Lt. Colonel, USAF (Ret.) – Goes by "Marlon" is currently an active member of both the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) and the Military Order of the World Wars (MOWW) national veteran service organizations. As a fellow companion of the MOWW, Lt. Colonel Ruiz has served as the organization's National Membership Committee Vice Chairman and as a junior and subsequently Senior Vice-Commander of the Department of Arizona for that organization. He has served and continues to serve as the current Santa Cruz Valley Chapter commander for the MOWW in Green Valley.

I am a retired career commissioned officer with 27 and a half years of active duty military, professional educator, diplomatic liaison officer and US Government Interagency service experience. While on active duty with the US Air Force, I served in a multitude of combat / instructor aviator missions, military academy educator assignments and diplomatic service / liaison officer positions. Among the most notable military service assignments are – having served as a B-52 flight instructor and combat mission commander, served as a professional military education academy institution associate professor at both the US Military Academy at West Point and the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, served as a former Political-Military Foreign Area Officer – Western Hemisphere Specialist and Defense Security Assistance Agency advisor in four countries - while assigned as a Defense Department asset to the US State Department, US Department of Homeland Security, Joint Interagency Counter-Drug Enforcement Task Force - South, US Defense Security Cooperation Agency, US Southern Command, US Southern Air Force Headquarters – 12th Air Force Headquarters, and serving as the US Military Group Ecuador Air Force Mission Chief in the Republic of Ecuador, South America, shortly before retiring from active duty in the summer of 2007. During my tenure as an Adjunct Instructor Faculty Staff member, I also served as an online Distance Learning Program Defense Contractor teaching asset with C2 Technologies, Inc. Some of the courses taught include but are solely limited to; teaching with the Air Command and Staff College Faculty – Online Masters Regional / Cultural Studies program, teaching for the Squadron Officers Leadership Development Course – "Expeditionary Leadership in the Intercultural Environment" and "Applied Leadership and Command" Certification courses. I live in the local Marana, AZ local area with my lovely wife of 30 years Adriana. Our son Christian and daughter Nicole reside in Austin, TX and Buena Park, CA respectively.
