Reminders:

- MOAA's LEGISLATIVE ACTION CENTER: If you have not already done so, register on the National MOAA website, moaa.org, Advocacy, and send a message to your political representatives to support the various MOAA initiatives which help support all military members, retirees, veterans, and military families.
- 2. MEMBERSHIP: There are four types of MOAA Membership: Regular Basic Member, Regular Annual Member, Surviving Spouse of Deceased Member, and Regular Life Member. If you are not already a Life Member of MOAA, please consider becoming one. You pay dues one time, you never pay National dues again, and you receive all the benefits of a Life Membership. If you do not wish to become a Life Member and are currently only a basic member, consider becoming a Regular Annual Member. The Chapter also collects dues that help sustain their programs. Dues are \$25/year for military members and \$15 for spouses/surviving spouses. If you have not yet paid your 2024 dues, please consider doing so. Scholarship & Educational Grants Dinner

Many chapter members joined us for our annual scholarship dinner on May 1st that was held at the American Legion Post #66. Our JROTC scholarship participation was a bit different this year.

Unfortunately, we did not receive any scholarship applications from either the Air Force JROTC unit at Nogales High School or the Army JROTC unit at Rio Rico High School. This was unusual, but we hope there will be scholarship candidates from those programs next year.

However, we did receive two outstanding scholarship candidates from the Naval JROTC program. And Cadet Kevin Reyes from Sahuarita High School received a \$2,500 scholarship from us. Kevin plans to study aerospace engineering at the University of Arizona. Another Naval JROTC cadet, Isabella Sizer, from Walden Grove High School, qualified for our scholarship, but she will not need it. She has been selected to attend the Naval Academy Preparatory School in Newport, Rhode Island. After successfully completing that year of study, Cadet Sizer will enter the Naval Academy. Cadet Sizer and her father attended our dinner, and we were happy to acknowledge her accomplishments.

We have now started offering educational grants to a few deserving veterans pursuing degrees at the University of Arizona. These grants will not impact their GI Bill finances but will help a lot to cover some of the many additional expenses these veterans encounter.

Two of the veterans who will receive these grants in the fall semester attended our scholarship dinner. One of them is Destiny Rivera who served six years in the USAF as an Arabic linguist. She is pursuing degrees in mathematics and Arabic. The other veteran is Eleazar Rios who served 10 years in the USN as a nuclear-trained electrician. He is pursuing a degree in chemical engineering, and he continues to serve in the Naval Reserve.

The other veteran who will receive our educational grant is Shyla Barton who served two years in the USMC in intelligence. She is pursuing a degree in East Asian studies and the Chinese language. Unfortunately, she was not able to join us at our dinner, but we will have a presentation for her at a future chapter event.

Our Chapter will once again be collecting non-perishable food items for the young airmen at the 162nd Wing, Arizona Air National Guard. The troops seem to like all types of Chef-Boy-R-Dee products, granola bars, pasta and sauces, tuna, and canned meats. Many of the airmen have young children so dried fruit,



cereal, fruit juices would also be appropriate. Paper, cleaning and hygiene products will also be accepted and much appreciated.

If it's too hot to shop but you still want to help, checks payable to MOAA S&MA Fund may be mailed to Green Valley MOAA, P.O. Box 1535, Green Valley, AZ 85622-1535 or mailed to or dropped off at 1908 E Longspur Place, GV 85614.

Groceries may be placed in the baskets in the Madera Clubhouse, 2055 E Quail Crossing Blvd., between July 1- 4. MOAA members will be in front of the clubhouse on July 4 between 7:15 and 9 a.m. to accept donations. If you will be travelling on July 4, you may leave donations at the McGee's, 1908 E. Longspur Place, first right after the Quail Creek waterfall, during the last week of June.

On July 4, right before and after the flag raising ceremony that will be conducted by the Naval JROTC cadets in front of the Clubhouse, MOAA members will be selling 50-50 raffle tickets to support its *Turkeys for the Troops* program at Thanksgiving time as well as Jim Click raffle tickets to support scholarships for JROTC cadets and veterans attending the University of Arizona. They hope to have the Jim Click truck on display too. One does not have to be present to win the 50-50 raffle for which the winning name will be drawn in the afternoon on July 4. The 50-50 raffle tickets are 6 for \$5, 14 for \$10 or 30 for \$20 while the Jim Click raffle tickets are \$25 each or 5 for \$100. The winning names for the Jeep Wrangler, first-class airline tickets for two and \$5,000 cash will be drawn on December 12.

COL Lynda Anne Linker, USA (Ret) passed away at age 76 on February 25, 2024, in Green Valley. Raised in a military family, Lynda spent most of her childhood in Iowa, Germany, and Texas. Lynda served as Green Valley MOAA Chapter President in 2009.

Lynda was a Community Health Nurse in the Army. She received her Bachelor's degree in nursing at the Texas Women's University in 1969 and Master's degree in nursing from the University of Arizona in 2000. Throughout her military career, she received many decorations and awards for her outstanding service to the community and for her dedication to the field of preventative medicine. Lynda retired in 1994, after 27 years of service, with the rank of Colonel.

Lynda was known for her generosity of spirit and her infectious smile. She was rarely seen without either a book or a knitting project in her hands. She enjoyed relaying


